Follows the life of the statesman who was a key figure in India's fight for independence from Great Britain.

B Ki Rappaport, Doreen. Martin's big words : the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. 1st ed. New York : Jump at the Sun/Hyperion Books for Children, c2001.  
Looks at the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, explaining his work to bring about a peaceful end to segregation.

A brief illustrated account of Rosa Parks' refusal to give up her seat on a bus in Montgomery, Alabama in 1955, and the subsequent bus boycott by the black community.

B Ro Robinson, Sharon, 1950-. Promises to keep : how Jackie Robinson changed America. New York : Scholastic, c2004.  
A biography of baseball legend Jackie Robinson, the first African American to play in the major leagues, as told by his daughter.

B Te Ransom, Candice F., 1952-. Mother Teresa. Minneapolis, Minn. : Carolrhoda Books, c2001.  
Mother Teresa was a nun working in Calcutta, India. Her efforts on behalf of the poor earned her a Nobel Prize.
